



Professor emeritus of Psychiatry and former Chairman of the Psychiatric Department at the University of Munich

Hans-Jürgen Möller studied medicine at the University of Göttingen and Hamburg in the Federal Republic of Germany. In 1972 he undertook his medical degree and proceeded to postgraduate training in psychiatry at the Max Planck Institute of Psychiatry in Munich. In 1982, he became professor of psychiatry at the Psychiatric Department of the Technical University in Munich and moved in 1988 to become professor of psychiatry and chairman of the Psychiatric Department at the University of Bonn. Since 1994 he has been professor of psychiatry and Chairman of the Psychiatric Department at the University of Munich. He is Since 2012 he is Professor emeritus.

Professor Dr. Möller's main research interests are the methodology of psychiatry, diagnostic procedures, evaluative research, , clinical psychopharmacology, and biological psychiatry. He has published more than 1000 original papers and reviews in German and international journals . His Hirsch Factor amounts to 116. Professor Dr. Möller president of the World Federation of Societies of Biological Psychiatry (WFSBP), of the European Psychiatric Association (EPA) , president of the International College of Neuropsychopharmacology (CINP) and president of the WPA Section Pharmacopsychiatry.
