



Torgny H. Svensson

Neuropsychopharmacology, Psychiatry and Neurology

Dr Torgny H. Svensson, M.D., Ph.D., is Professor of Pharmacology at the Karolinska Institutet in Stockholm, Sweden, since 1983 and has also served as a member of the Nobel Assembly over two decades. He received his M.D./ Ph.D. degrees from the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, and subsequently spent several years in the US, working both at Yale University Medical School, Depts. of Pharmacology and Psychiatry, and at The Salk Institute, La Jolla, CA. His major scientific contributions concern the regulation and function of brain monoamine systems, the mode of action of antidepressant and antipsychotic drugs as well as drugs for Parkinson's disease and various augmentation strategies for these disorders. He has also elucidated the neurobiological basis of nicotine dependence and its treatment and, recently, contributed to the development of a novel and promising drug for Mb Parkinson.

Dr. Svensson is also member (Fellow) of the ACNP as well as the CINP, for which he served as President 2006-2008.
